

# PENNSYLVANIA FIREWORKS LAW

As we near the Fourth of July and firework usage increases, be aware of the state laws. If you choose to use fireworks at any point, remember to be courteous and respectful. Be "a good neighbor."

Fireworks laws that all residents must follow:

- Purchaser and operator must be at least 18 years old.
- Cannot be ignited or discharged on public or private property without express permission of the property owner.
- Cannot be directed at another person.
- Cannot be used from or directed at a building or vehicle.
- Cannot be used within 150 feet of a building or vehicle regardless if the building or vehicle is owned by the user of the consumer fireworks.
- Cannot be discharged while the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance or another drug.
